Sharps Disposal Options for Thurston County Residents

What are Sharps?

Sharps are hypodermic needles, syringes, IV tubing, lancets, auto injectors and scalpel blades. Sharps are used in the home by people with chronic diseases such as diabetes, multiple sclerosis, HIV, hepatitis B and hepatitis C.

What should I do with my Sharps?

Sharps may carry germs, so take care when discarding them. Never flush them down the toilet or place them loose into the trash. Follow these safe disposal tips:

- Place sharps in a manufactured sharps container (available at pharmacies, medical supply stores, and medical providers) or an empty, sturdy plastic bottle with a tight fitting lid. Two-liter pop, bleach or laundry detergent bottles work well. Water bottles (made of a weaker plastic) aren't a good choice.
- When your container is full, secure the lid tightly.
- If you are using an empty plastic bottle, tape the lid for added security and write the words "sharps waste" in large letters on the bottle with a permanent marker.
- Place the sharps container in with your trash, never with your recyclables.
